Each member of the band gives contributions to the songwriting.

New female singer (a girl named Lorena, slightly older than the rest of the band) and first bass player joining. First radio appearance, without the new singer, busy with a theatre project and on the occasion replaced by Eleonora Lana and Chiara Vidonis. Lorena leaves the band very soon.

The band performs and records a final gig before Eno moves to Edinburgh. They are willing to feature female vocals on this special occasion, but Elena Vinci is not available, so Chiara Gelmini joins back for this one-off show.

Once in Edinburgh, Eno meets his new associate Jez McKenzie and together they choose Thomas Jones as new lead guitarist and Eno's co-songwriter and Viara Ivanova as female vocalist. They can't find a fiddler though. Also this line-up never materializes as a whole because Jez quits promptly, due to his new unavailability caused by work duties.

Eno and Tam write and record "Homeless in Edinburgh", "Plasterboards in Leith" and the now lost original version of "Bleeding Nose Blues". Ross Finnegan joins on guitar, still without a fiddler. Personal troubles bring Eno back to Trieste before Viara could even start singing with the band and the whole "Scottish" experience of Aberdeen Rail Station comes to an end in a few months.

Gabriele quits and Simone rejoins. Still there's something missing. No fiddler, no gigs, no new songs but a couple of covers. By the end of 2008 this line-up breaks up and Eno and Berno start considering new musical directions. They write "The Homeless in Edinburgh Is Back" for a guitar/drum/bass line-up to come.

With the main band on hiatus, the "classic" line-up reunites as an acoustic side-project meant to exist in parallel with the new band to come. Yet after a few weeks they give up: the old chemistry is gone. In the year of Aberdeen Rail Station's tenth anniversary, Eno, Alessio, Seppa and Simone, alone in a room, play all together for the last time.

Before partying ways, Eno and Berno make a last attempt when Federico Furlani joins on bass for the third time, but it takes too long to find a suitable drummer and a rehearsal room. A little work is done acoustically at Berno's place, but the lack of enthusiasm seems to be unavoidable.

When Olga Zakharova is ready to join on fiddle, Cristina leaves the band. The summer is spent waiting for Adriana Tomisic to audition as a possible new singer. When she does, she gets the job, and the band is a five-piece once again. But in two months only, Olga is offered a job as a violinist at Teatro La Scala in Milano and Aberdeen Rail Station is once again in need of a fiddler.

The band gets in touch with young electric violinist Pier Paolo Foti and they try a collaboration. A concert is scheduled and Seppa Frattini is brought back in to help on some songs (which marks the only time Aberdeen Rail Station performed live with two violins, one acoustic and one electric).

After some initial enthusiasm, the band and Pier Paolo Foti part ways and Seppa, having performed as a guest fiddler at Pier Paolo's only gig with the band, remains for another show before quitting one last time.

Simone Kodermaz joins on fiddle, but the band, after a year with no fiddler and no enthusiasm, is in bad health. Two songs recorded for digital release. Only one gig, and not a good one. Adriana quits when she moves to Cervignano and the band, before making decisions about the future, goes on summer hiatus.

After the summer hiatus, Simone Kodermaz does not return to the band. It will take two years before they find a new fiddler. Fiore Apollonio joins back on vocals, but there seems to be no band to join. Very few rehearsals, no gigs. They work sporadically on some recordings featuring guests from Aberdeen Rail Station's past.

Without Simone, Assa and Eno are often in disagreement: it is time for them to end their seven-year long musical relationship.

After a cuople of months, the band and The band decides not to hire a new lead quitarist immediatly. Nemanja Vujić is set to perform one more show in March as a guest (also some members of the Water Gypsy Band from Dublin are expected to guest) but the coronavirus stops all activities before the project happens. Some recording studio sessions are planned and put on hold by the pandemic too.
